Dear Families,

<u>Department for Education (Dfe) visit</u>: We have recently been notified of our next Dfe visit which will be on Thursday 21st November. As a new school, we do not have an Ofsted until the third year of opening which will be next academic year so in the meantime, the Dfe visit to ensure that everything is on track for the school to be at least good at its first inspection. Our External Expert for this visit is Mr George Bulman and he will spend the day viewing the teaching and learning, chatting to the children, checking safeguarding procedures and looking at the children's books. He has also asked to talk to parents as you arrive to collect your children at the end of the day. So please do stop and have a chat and let him know how your child is doing at school. The report that is produced is not a public document unlike an Ofsted report and is only shared with the Governors and the Trust (REAch2), however, I will share the main findings of the day with you via our newsletter. We are very much looking forward to showing all we have achieved so far with the children and all the things we are doing.

<u>Little Stars After School Club:</u> This is now held at school and the children are collected from the classroom at 3:15pm and taken up to one of our Year 2 classrooms which will be the home for Little Stars this academic year. A timetable of activities includes using the hall for games

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some afternoons and table top games and crafts in the classroom as well as using the interactive whiteboard.
