In Talk for Writing this week, we have been learning the rhyme 'Itsy Bitsy Monkey' and learning about the dangers of climbing a coconut tree! The children have put together actions already to support a retelling of the rhyme. They were also quite fascinated by the coconut that Mrs Blackshaw brought into Nursery. We had lots of great words to describe how it looked and felt including 'hairy' and 'sloshy' when the children shook it and heard the milk inside. Harris thought about the shape of the coconut too and decided that it was an 'oval'- fabulous! Everyone also had a chance to taste both the milk and the coconut itself. It wasn't too popular but well done to everyone for having a try.

In Maths, the children have been using their developing number knowledge to 'count on' as we put some wild animals back in their cages one by one. They have also used Numicon to look at different ways to use combinations of two or more shapes to represent a number. There will be some great examples coming up soon on Tapestry!

The afternoon Harriers enjoyed making some paper pancakes with Mrs Buckley on Tuesday afternoon, before taking them out for a pancake race. Other activities this week have included using wax crayons and a variety of materials for rubbings to create different animal skins, exploring the zoo in our role play area and trying to identify different animals just by listening to their sounds. It's been a busy week indeed!
