#### Dear Families.

This week has flown by! The children are growing in confidence each day and making some lovely friendships. Due to the small class size and indeed, the small school size, it really is like being one big family! Yesterday we had chance to use Scientia's Reading bus at lunchtime as it was too wet to go outside. We had lots of fun sitting on this refurbished bus to share books, colour and chat. Have a look overleaf at some of the photos. We really are getting very used to buses!

Miss Coxon and Mrs Blackshaw have completed the Baseline assessments of the children and will now tailor the curriculum accordingly to ensure each of them reach their potential during this first year with us. Next week, you will receive an email with log in details to access our on line learning journal (Tapestry) for the children. Here you will be able to view all the observations the teaching staff have made since they started with us and see some really lovely photographs of them at work and at play. You will also be able to upload photographs and comments from home to help build a complete picture of what your child is like both at home and at school. This tool will be the basis of Parent Consultation Evening discussions and help to form a picture of your child's progress throughout the year. In addition to this, the children will have a Maths and English exercise book in school where they can record work too.

Next week, the children will start their first Talk for Writing' unit, 'Owl Babies' so look out for them reciting the story with some special actions to go along with it. The timing of our trip fits in perfectly with this and will help the children relate to the story even more. The children will also start their Phonic lessons which is where they start to learn all the different sounds letters make individually or together which is the foundations of them learning to read and spell. There will be some information sessions about this later in the term so that you know what and how we're teaching it and how you can help at home. Please see key dates below.

<u>In more curriculum news:</u> we have booked Kimbles music and movement to come in every Friday afternoon to do a session with the children as it was such a hit at our Teddy Bear's Picnic in June. Rose started last week with us and the children have been asking ever since when she's coming back! They had a great time and you can see some of these sessions on the Tapestry app next week.

<u>Clothing for the trip on Tuesday</u>: after discussions with the rest of the staff, we think it is best if the children come in their own warm, comfortable clothing on Tuesday so that they can really enjoy the experience in the woods with the owls and not worry about getting uniform dirty or not being warm enough. Therefore, please send your child in warm, comfortable clothing that you don't mind them getting dirty or messy in. The children can change into their wellies before we go or they can wear trainers. If it's raining, all children will wear wellies.

<u>Online Payment System:</u> some of you may be familiar with online payment systems. These are cashless systems that parent use to pay for trips and clubs and when the children are older, school dinners. We are just getting this set up so this trip should be the only time you will need to pay cash. Parents generally find it easier to manage the payments on line, rather than having to get to the bank etc. More details to follow in the next few weeks.

<u>Macmillan Coffee Morning:</u> the date for this is next Friday, however, as we are currently at Scientia we are going to postpone this until we have moved into our school building. We thought it would be really nice to have a coffee morning when we had moved in so that you can have a tour around the school and join us for coffee and cake, hopefully raising some money for such a worthy cause. As soon as we have a move in date, we will advertise the coffee morning so any keen bakers (and I know we have some!) be on standby! There will be an official opening ceremony for the school in March 2019. Again, more details to follow regarding this.

<u>Dates:</u> Please see next page. We have added more dates for the academic year as promised last week. There will be other dates added over time but we hope to do this with plenty of notice for trips which have yet to be finalised for the year. There is a slight change to the Harvest Festival as we have since been informed that we will be having a Trust Review on that date, to make sure everything is as it should be and this will take most of the day.
