<u>Car Parking</u> - We are expecting the car park gates to be automated at some point next week. This means they will be closed to ensure our school meets all its Safeguarding regulations. If you need to drive up to school for anything e.g. collecting your child if they are unwell or collecting for an appointment, please press the buzzer on the post on the right hand side. Mrs Dennis will then speak to you and will let you in. During school hours, you will also need to press the buzzer on the pedestrian gate to be let in, however, at the beginning and end of the day, it will be opened. As soon as we have a firm date for operation of the gates, we will let you know by text message.

Please can I ask that you park considerately around the Henhurst Ridge estate when dropping off or collecting your child, being mindful of resident's driveways and being careful of obstructing the free flow of the traffic around the estate. The single yellow lines have been painted at places where parking in those areas could obstruct the bus getting through and other such vehicles. The single yellow line means parking is restricted between 8:30 and 9:30am and from 3-4pm, therefore parking is not allowed in those areas during these times. Hopefully you have already spotted some good places to park a little further up Henhurst Ridge or at the entrance before the bus stop. Please allow yourself enough time to be able to park and then make the short walk to school so that you are in time for the start of the day.
