<u>Catering Assistant Required:</u> Due to our increase in numbers, a position has become available in our kitchen for a Catering Assistant. <u>Pre-owned uniform:</u> several parents have suggested having a pre-owned uniform rail for parents to donate uniform that no longer fits, giving the opportunity for other parents to make a donation for the items which will go directly into buying more books for our Eco library. This initiative helps in lots of different ways. It not only helps to buy more things for the children but means that parents can buy uniform at a good price as well as supporting our sustainable living ethos. We are hoping to launch this in the next couple of weeks. If you have any good quality uniform that no longer fits, please wash and send into school.

<u>Uniform:</u> On the subject of uniform, we have had several reports from parents that our new whiteboard pens are almost impossible to wash off the children's uniform! We bought more expensive whiteboard pens this year as they last longer. It seems they last so long that they don't come out of anything! We are busy researching other pens to buy to replace these so that this doesn't keep happening. We bought a small pack to try and tested them on an old school blouse and it washed out beautifully...however it stained the whiteboard and wouldn't come off the whiteboard when the children tested it out! So we will continue to hunt down a whiteboard pen that both comes out of clothes and off whiteboards!

Just another couple of uniform reminders:

• Ties are an integral part of our school uniform and should be worn every day. I am noticing several children that are not wearing them, please can you ensure your child is wearing theirs every day please? We pride ourselves on being a smart school which is

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often commented by visitors. When children are not in complete school uniform, it affects this.

- Stud earrings if a child's ears are pierced they should only be wearing a small stud earring. We request that where possible, children do not wear earrings to school on a P.E. day. This is Wednesdays for Reception Class and both Tuesdays and Wednesdays for Class One.
- Water bottles must contain water not squash or juice. Sugary drinks are very damaging for children's teeth, therefore only plain water is allowed in the children's water bottles. Please do not send in anything else as your child will not be allowed to drink it.

Thank you as always for your cooperation in these matters. It is very much appreciated.

<u>Parent Governor:</u> Just a reminder that the parent governor application forms came out this week and the deadline is 9am on **MONDAY** 7th OCTOBER. Please do give this role careful consideration. It is a vital role for the effective running of a school and we want to make sure we have the best governors to do this and that could very well be you!

<u>Parent Consultation Sessions:</u> Coming home today is a letter about Parent Consultations: when they are and how to sign up for your session. We very much look forward to seeing you there!

<u>Grandparents' lunch:</u> We are all very excited to welcome our grandparents in on Wednesday for our special lunch.
