Dear Families,

We've had another busy and exciting week here at school. I've enjoyed going into each class to do lesson observations and see how the children are getting on in their Maths. In Reception class, they were learning all the different ways of making 5 by visiting Miss Jack's shop where everything was 5p! Mrs Carlile was in the outdoor area exploring different ways of adding beanbags together. Alexia kindly invited me to join them in the Messy Kitchen and offered me a lovely meal of grapes and cucumber! Year Ones were grappling with making 2 digit numbers out of Base 10 equipment and then adding one more, all the way up to 40. They really did enjoy exploring these numbers in this practical way!

<u>Maths Toolkit Time lessons</u>: In Maths we want to give the children opportunity to be fluent in the basic skills they need like knowing their number bonds to 5 or 10 or being able to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and then onto recalling their times tables. So we have designed and introduced a 15 minute additional Maths lesson called 'Toolkit Time' where the children have a chance to practise and learn all these skills, giving them the tools to be able to be brilliant Mathematicians - hence the name. So far the lessons have been really successful and the children have thoroughly enjoyed them and been engaged. Later in the academic year, we will invite you in to come and have a look at this part of our curriculum so you can see what we're doing but also so that you can do it at home too should you want to.

<u>Assemblies:</u> Reception Class had their assembly on Monday and it was fantastic! They recalled the story of 'Shhh' really well and shared some lovely Art work and songs with us too - they have been busy! Thank you to all the staff over the past two weeks for preparing these for us. Thank you also to Mr Parker for telling us all about our 11B411 adventures - the response has been tremendous. If you were unable to be there and would like to know more, please see Mr Parker to find out more.

<u>Reading Under the Stars</u>: Our first 11B411 adventure for Year 1 will be on **Friday 6th March from 5:15-6:15pm**. It is going to be a fun hour of reading outside and inside, star gazing (fingers crossed for a clear night), wrapped up and enjoying a cup of hot chocolate and biscuits! Can't wait! <u>Eco Meeting</u>: We had our first Eco Meeting with our newly elected Eco Leaders on Tuesday which was great! They all had lots of ideas on how we can continue our Eco work! Thank you to Mrs Wagstaffe, our parent representative, for her time and contribution. We were very excited to hear from Mr Parker that we have applied for the Green Flag award which is the highest achievement for Eco Schools which we can hardly believe after only being open 18 months! 
