


<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>During free choice times, we will be supported to find ways to take account of each other's ideas about how to organise a game. We will demonstrate our growing confidence by speaking as part of an increasingly large group. We will continue to access the resources that we need both indoors and outdoors, asking an adult if we need some help. We will learn to recognise different feelings in ourselves, naming these emotions. This will help us to learn ways to manage our feelings and help us to remain calm and happy.</p>	<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>We will share photos and videos from home during Tapestry Time, answering 'how' and 'why' questions. We will learn more about the art of conversation, listening to what people say to us and responding with relevant comments and questions. Adults will help us to use the past, present and future tenses accurately by modelling the correct use whenever we make a mistake.</p>	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>We will continue with our PE lessons which includes a wide range of team games that help us to stay active and healthy. We will also have a weekly dance lesson from a dance teacher, helping us to learn to control our bodies and move in new ways to music. We will visit the cookery room to try foods from around the world as part of our project about journeys.</p>	 <p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>We will make vehicles as part of our project, choosing what we would like to create. We will collage, draw, paint and construct with junk modelling materials. We will use role-play to re-enact stories, helping us to understand the structure of stories. We will make boats for My Gumpy (from our Talk for Writing sessions). We will try them out in the water tray, exploring which materials are waterproof and which float. We will investigate how many animals can fit into our boats before they sink!</p>
<p>English</p> <p>We will focus on reading our reading books every day. This will help us to read simple sentences with increasing independence and to answer simple questions about what we have read to show our understanding. We will study the story 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' in our Talk for Writing sessions before we write and tell our own versions of the story. We will celebrate World Book Day, dressing up and taking part in lots of fun activities!</p>	<p>Mathematics</p> <p>We will start the half term by focussing on the language needed to describe weight using heavier and lighter. We will work to ensure that we recognise and can order numbers from 1-20 and solve problems using these skills. We will learn to share an amount equally. We will learn to check our work, changing any errors to ensure that our work is accurate.</p>	<p>Understanding the World</p> <p>We will enjoy looking for signs of Spring, watching our school bulbs to grow and enjoying the warming weather. We will work with Mr Parker to grow salads, vegetables and herbs in the garden in our outdoor area. We will also have a visit from a local farm who will help us to learn more about food, farming and caring for animals.</p>
