Dear Families.

We've had a fantastic week! The children have really settled in now and everything is working like clockwork (although better not speak too soon!) The teachers are working hard with them on all the different areas of the curriculum and the children are responding well to all the new and revised learning. See below where the teachers have done a quick round up of the week to give you a flavour of what they've been up to.

This week's round up around the school:

<u>Nursery:</u> This week, we have been thinking about our feelings and emotions. We have been playing with the song 'If you're happy and you know it' as we have changed 'happy' to a few different emotions. We have had some great fun with 'If you're grumpy and you know it' as the children have loved folding their arms and pulling a grumpy face!

<u>Reception:</u> This week in Reception, we're really proud of our children who have been reading words in phonics. We've explored lots of different story books with 'Ketchup on your Cornflakes' being a definite favourite that the children love to read independently. In maths, we've been practising sharing equally - the children particularly enjoyed dressing up as animals and sharing their food equally!

<u>Year One:</u> We have started a new project: Splendid Skies. We have been learning all about the weather and have learnt a new song about the seasons! The children love dancing to it. The children have had a new role play area - an airport. This has provided the children with an opportunity to dress up for a holiday, pack a suitcase and look through holiday brochures!

<u>Year Two:</u> We have been working hard writing our own pirate stories based on the book 'The Night Pirates'. In project, we have been learning about Grace Darling and have designed and made our own lighthouses which are displayed in the library area - see photograph below. In maths, we have been learning to subtract by regrouping and done really well on what is a hard concept!

Attendance: Our attendance continues to be amazing at 99%! Thank you so much everyone - this really is brilliant and I do believe that is why our children are settling back in so well.

<u>Parking:</u> Thank you for everyone's efforts regarding the parking. Mr Parker tells me that it is flowing really well on the whole. If you're unsure where to park, please do ask Mr Parker and he will be happy to help.
