Dear Families.

I will be sending a survey out in the next week or two also to gauge how we are doing with this.

<u>INSET day - Friday 15th January:</u> Next Friday has been a planned INSET day for a few months where the teaching staff will receive remote training on the Talk for Writing approach that we use to teach writing. We are unable to change this and therefore, we will still be going ahead with it so the school will be <u>closed to all children that day.</u>
