<u>Track & Trace</u>: We are required by the government to assist with Track & Trace during school holidays so please let us know if your child becomes symptomatic or tests positive for COVID19 up to and including Easter Monday. This is because you can be carrying the virus up to 48 hours before you become symptomatic. This way, we can then get in touch with any close contacts of your child as they will be required to self-isolate. We sincerely hope we do not need to get in touch with anyone over the holidays.

<u>Parent's Evening Tuesday 20th April & Thursday 22nd April:</u> Apologies for the short notice around the signup sheet being displayed yesterday. Hopefully, you have had a chance to sign up for an appointment and if not, please contact the school office and Miss Batkin or Mrs Dennis will only be too happy to help you. A Teams invite will then be sent to you before the day. Please try and log in to your child's account before the appointment time to ensure it is working and you have the correct password etc. If you have any difficulties, please don't hesitate to let the school office know and we will try and resolve these as soon as possible. Hopefully, this will be the last one we have to do like this!

<u>School Photographer</u>: On Friday 23rd April, the school photographer will be coming into school to take the annual school photographs of the children. This will be done socially distanced. We look forward to sharing the proofs with you after the event!

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<u>Uniform:</u> Just a few uniform reminders. Ties should be worn at all times other than on PE days and when wearing the summer dresses. Earrings should be small studs and should not be worn on PE days. This is for health & safety reasons and to protect your child. The larger the earrings, the easier they can be pulled out causing damage to the ear lobe. Finally, nail varnish is not allowed so please ensure this is removed before the children come back to school. Many thanks for your support with this.

<u>Staffing:</u> We are delighted that Miss Elliott will be able to return to school after Easter due to the guidance around shielding being lifted. She is desperate to be back in the classroom and I know the children will be overjoyed to see her! Miss Johal will also join us in the Reception Team after Easter to cover Miss Jack's Maternity leave. Miss Jack doesn't start her leave until the 23rd April so it will give both teachers a good chance to continue handing over during this time. A huge thank you to Mrs Cunningham and Mrs Saleem who have done a brilliant job in looking after our Reception children over the past few weeks. Both teachers have told me how much they have enjoyed working with the children, what a joy they have been and how they hope to come back again whenever we might need someone. That's always lovely to hear from teachers that work in lots of different schools!
