### Message from Mrs Hopkins:

#### Dear Families.

Welcome back to the start of our 4<sup>th</sup> academic year as a school! We are really excited not only to have grown as far as Key Stage 2 and using classrooms upstairs but to be able to leave the majority of the COVID19 restrictions behind. Please see attached letter as to what this looks like. It was a very emotional moment on Monday morning when the whole school was in the hall for our first assembly as a school since March 2020! It was a very special moment indeed!

The children have all come back to school looking super smart, happy and ready to learn so thank you for all the preparations you have done to help make this happen. Please can I just remind parents to ensure they have written their child's name inside each item of clothing. With so many items of uniform in the same size in the same class, it makes it very easy to get them mixed up. Thank you for your help with this.

The playground work has been a real inconvenience so thank you for your patience and assistance with this. I have been told that the works will be completed on <u>Tuesday</u> so we can start accessing the playground at the start and end of the day again from Wednesday. A reminder of where to drop your child/ren off and collect will be sent out on Monday.

<u>Curriculum overviews:</u> These will be sent home on Monday and can be accessed via our website. They tell you at a glance what your child/ren will be taught during each half term and ways you can support this at home. Throughout the year, we will be hosting workshops and information sessions about different curriculum areas so that you are well informed as to why we teach subjects in the way we do and again how you can support this at home. Some of these are already listed on our 'Dates for your Diary' sheet attached. More will be publicised.

'Dates for your Diary': This will be emailed out on Monday morning which has most of the key dates for this academic year on there, please do make note of them on your calendar. As other dates are added, we will update the website copy so that is always up to date. Dates to be added are events such as: school photographer, class trips, guests coming into school etc. Some events advertised may not specify whether they will be in person or via Teams/Zoom. We want to return to normal as much as possible, but we do have to be guided by whatever the local COVID19 situation is nearer to the time of the event.

<u>COVID19</u>: Please read the attached letter that outlines the changes that are now in place in and around school since the restrictions have eased. The letter also tells you what to do if your child displays <u>COVID19</u> symptoms and what will happen if someone in school tests positive.

Reading books & Home Learning: Reading books will be re issued to those year groups that are ready to have them shortly. We will also reopen our library in the next few weeks so children can check out a book for reading for pleasure purposes. Our Home Learning strategy will be shared with you next week via email.

Road works on Henhurst Hill: We have been informed today that the gas works on Henhurst Hill will last for approximately 4 more weeks. Unfortunately, next week, a 3-way traffic light system will be set up at the exit on Aviation Lane. This will obviously cause even more disruption. Please be assured that school will be flexible during this time and no late marks will be given to any child arriving late due to this. Equally if you are delayed collecting your child/ren, please do not worry, they will be well looked after until you get here. Please just get here safely and park responsibly. Thank you.

Parking: As we start the new academic year with a new cohort of children and without the separate times for each class coming in and out of school, the traffic congestion and parking is inevitably going to be a challenge. Please can we stress the importance of parking responsibly so that we can keep all of our children safe. When people park inconsiderately or block other motorists then it poses a risk to the children. The school continues to work with the Local Authority and the Borough Council to try and find a solution to this issue.

<u>Communication:</u> There are several ways that we will work in partnership with you. Please see the list below:

- Catching your child's class teacher or Teaching Assistant at the beginning and end of the day - this has not been as easy at the moment but will get easier next week
- Messaging the teaching staff via
   Tapestry or Seesaw this will get
   directly to the staff working with your child
- Phoning school to leave a message for the teaching staff to call you back when they are not teaching
- Emailing into the school office for general enquiries
- Reading the monthly newsletter & text messages
- Following us on Twitter
- Please do book an appointment with Mrs Hopkins if your child's class teacher is unable to answer your query.

PE Kits: Just a reminder that PE kits are to be kept in school during each half term and then they will be sent home to be washed during the holidays.

Children should not come into school wearing their PE kit. Please do speak to your child's class teacher if you have any questions about this.

Uniform: Ties are a key part of our uniform, please ensure your child is wearing one each day and that it is labelled in case it comes off. Jewellery is not allowed due to health & safety reasons except one small pair of stud earrings and a watch. The earrings should be removed on PE days or taped over so that it is safe for them to do PE. Nail varnish is not allowed.

Catering: As you will remember from our last newsletter, Miss Karina our Catering Manager went on Maternity leave in July. She gave birth to a beautiful baby boy, Tim and is very much enjoying her time at home with him. Unfortunately, Chartwells (our Catering provider) have been unable to find a replacement for her due to the national catering staff shortage. Christchurch Primary School have been helping us out with their fabulous staff whilst Chartwells continue to advertise for a replacement. During this time, we will continue to have a reduced menu although the new tomato pasta is proving very popular!
