Road works on Henhurst Hill: These have now gone and getting to and from school is much easier. If you remember, we had advertised the start time of school being 8:45am. Due to the significant delays of the road works, we put this back until 8:50am. As the road works have now gone, the start time of school will resume to 8:45am. Please ensure your child is in school by this time. We will give a week so everyone has a chance to get used to the revised time and then after that, from Monday 15th November, any child arriving later than 8:45am, will be marked late. <u>Poppies:</u> It is that time of year already! Poppies go on sale on Monday 8th November and will be on sale all week. Poppies are for a small donation (no set price). If you would like your child to have one, please send some money in with your child. We will also be selling poppy merchandise at the end of each day next week under the canopy by the bike racks. Remembrance Day Service: On Thursday, the children will be having a special Remembrance Day service in the hall where they will recite poems and songs that pay respect to those that have gone before. They will also lay poppy wreaths that they have made. Some of our elderly residents have been invited to join us for this so they can remember friends and family they lost in the world wars. They will no doubt be impressed with the level of respect the children will demonstrate.

<u>Uniform:</u> Please read the following information and do your best to adhere to it.

Ties are a key part of our uniform, please ensure your child is wearing one each day and that it is labelled in case it comes off. Jewellery is not allowed due to health & safety reasons except one small pair of stud earrings and a watch. The earrings should be removed on PE days or taped over so that it is safe for them to do PE. Nail varnish is not allowed.
