Message from Mrs Hopkins:

Dear Families,

I can't believe we are already in February, although I think a lot of us are quite happy to see the end of January that brought such arise in COVID cases affecting many of our pupils, parents and staff. It has been an exceptionally busy and challenging time when we've had so many staff off, of what is a relatively small staffing team. Year 3 'The Kamkwamba' Class assembly: This is scheduled for <u>Tuesday 8th February at 9am</u>. After much consideration, we are still going to go ahead with this event but we ask that you please do the following to ensure we can keep everyone safe:

- Only 2 people per family to attend
- Wear masks unless medically exempt
- Do a Lateral Flow Test on the morning of the event and if positive, please do not attend
- Socially distance throughout the event

As you will be dropping your child off between 8:30 & 8:45am and the assembly doesn't start until 9am, the Friends of Henhurst will kindly be providing refreshments in the hall before the assembly starts for a small donation. Please ensure your car is parked responsibly as it will be parked for longer than usual. The assembly will last about 20 minutes. We very much look forward to seeing you there.

Children's Mental Health & ECO Week: As part of Children's Mental Health Week, we are going to be completing activities to help children have and maintain good mental health. One such way is being outside and so on Friday, Mrs Clemens (our friendly next-door neighbour & school volunteer) will be coordinating an Eco Day with all classes as they spend time outside completing an Eco orienteering activity as well as lots of other things throughout the day and week. COVID19: As mentioned in the opening message, cases do seem to be plateauing, but we are still getting new cases weekly. Please continue to be as vigilant as you have been to symptoms and getting a PCR for your child if needed. When we notify you that there has been a case in your child's class, please do carry out a Lateral Flow Test on your child for 7 days as many of the children are asymptomatic so this will help identify anymore cases. We are still asking any visitors into school or into the main entrance to wear a face covering as an additional precaution and staff are still wearing face coverings in communal areas. Thank you as always for your continued, brilliant support that we have received - it is greatly appreciated and has absolutely made a difference in the number of cases in school!

11B411 - 10 Good Deeds! As part of being a REAch2 school, we take part in the 11B411 initiative which sets out 11 adventures that children will have before they are 11. Our parents in Year 2 & 3 will be more familiar with this as pre-Pandemic, this was very much a feature of our school. Obviously completing such activities as well as school trips has not been possible. With us slowly returning to normal, we will be relaunching this as well as scheduling class trips in. Our first whole school adventure is 10 Good Deeds. Over the coming 2 weeks, the children will be taking part in 10 Good deeds that they will be carrying out. Mothers' Day lunch: This is scheduled for Wednesday 23rd March and again we really want to try and host this event. The Friends of Henhurst: The Friends of Henhurst met last week to discuss what events they could put on for the children for the rest of this term. Information will be released shortly of what they have planned. The next meeting will be advertised soon, we hope you can make it!

New pupils: We are delighted to welcome a new pupil into Year 1 and into The Thunberg Class. Zaid joined us a few weeks ago and has settled in so well! A warm welcome to him and his family.

Parish Council meeting held on 25th January.

We hosted the Branston Parish Council Meeting here 2 weeks ago and one of the main items on the agenda was school parking around the estate. Please see an outline of the key issues raised and ways forward. - There was a good attendance from residents and one parent, all of whom were given ample time and scope to air their views.
- There was general agreement that both residents and parents have to work together to aim at achieving a solution to the parking problem.
- There was an understanding that the school building is owned by Staffordshire County Council, and that REAch2 lease the building and aren't in a position to alter the traffic flow arrangements currently in place this is Staffordshire County Council's responsibility.
- Both residents and parents understand the problems associated with the parking and, while some individual problems were aired, there was a particular concern about the safety of the children both now and in the future as the number of pupils increase.
- Concern was raised about the possible inability of Emergency vehicles and delivery vehicles being able to gain access to properties should the need arise when parents are dropping off or picking up children.
- Concerns were raised about the safety of elderly residents on the estate that may need wheelchair and mobility access via pavements that are blocked due to cars parking on them.
- It was agreed to set up a Working Group consisting of interested parties (i.e., parents, residents, school staff, police, local and county councillors and road safety personnel) to get together with the aim of putting a coherent plan to the relevant parties in Stafford to sort this problem out, both now and for when the school is at full capacity.
- A zoom meeting is planned for some time in February to move this forward.
