

Year 1 Home Learning: Summer 1: Local Area



Home learning ideas and activities:

- Read or enjoy having read to you as many 'Traditional Tales' as you like e.g. Hansel and Gretel, Billy Goats Gruff, Jack and the Beanstalk. Can you spot things that are the same in all the tales? Do they all have a hero and a villain? Do they all start with 'Once upon a time'? (Reading)
- Write a 5 sentence story where the 5 sentences start with Once upon a time...; One day...; Unfortunately, ...; Fortunately...; In the end,.... (Writing)
- What plants do you have in your local area? Do you know their names? Can you draw and label them? (Science)
- Research a Hindu celebration. Can you draw an image to show the celebration? (RE)
- Can you create a piece of art from things you collect in your local area? Perhaps you could print with the objects you find. Perhaps you could rub your crayon over a piece of paper whilst you rest it against a tree. (Art)

Reading:

Please read the book sent home in your child's reading wallet daily or every other day.

Please ensure you sign the reading record and send it into school daily so we know that the book has been read and can then change it. Books will be changed every Thursday.

Your child will also benefit from practising their speed sounds daily.

Maths Facts!

With your child, continue to practise:

- Number families within 10 e.g. $4+3=7$, $3+4=7$, $7-4=3$, $7-3=4$
- Counting to or beyond 100 (and backwards!)
- Number formation
- Knowing which number is greater and smaller within 20 and by how many e.g. 17 is greater than 13 by 4.
- Knowing the names and properties of common 2D and 3D shapes
